GERMANTOWN HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT SELECTED AS A CANDIDATE FOR THE UNITED STATES PRESIDENTIAL SCHOLARS PROGRAM

Mr. Joel R. Farren, Germantown High School Principal, received correspondence from the United States Department of Education-The Commission on Presidential Scholars, informing him that Derek Fairburn, a senior at Germantown High School, has been selected as a candidate for the United States Presidential Scholars Program. Candidacy is based on outstanding performance on the ACT Assessment or the College Board SAT; nomination by the Chief State School Officer (CSSO) or one of their partner recognition organizations; nomination by the CSSO as a candidate in Career and Technical Education; or by the National YoungArts Foundation (YA), as a candidate in the Arts. This program was established in 1964 by Executive Order of the President to recognize some of our nation's most distinguished graduating seniors of their accomplishments in many areas: academic, success, leadership, and service to school and community. In 1979 it was expanded to recognize students who demonstrate exceptional scholarship and talent in the visual, creative, and performing arts. In 2015, the program was expanded once again to recognize students who demonstrate ability and accomplishment in career and technical fields. Annually, up to 161 U.S. Presidential Scholars are chosen from among each year's senior class, representing excellence in education and the promise of greatness in America's youth. All Scholars are invited to Washington, DC in June for their National Recognition Program, featuring various events and enrichment activities and culminating in the presentation of the Presidential Scholars Medallion during the White House-sponsored ceremony.
