



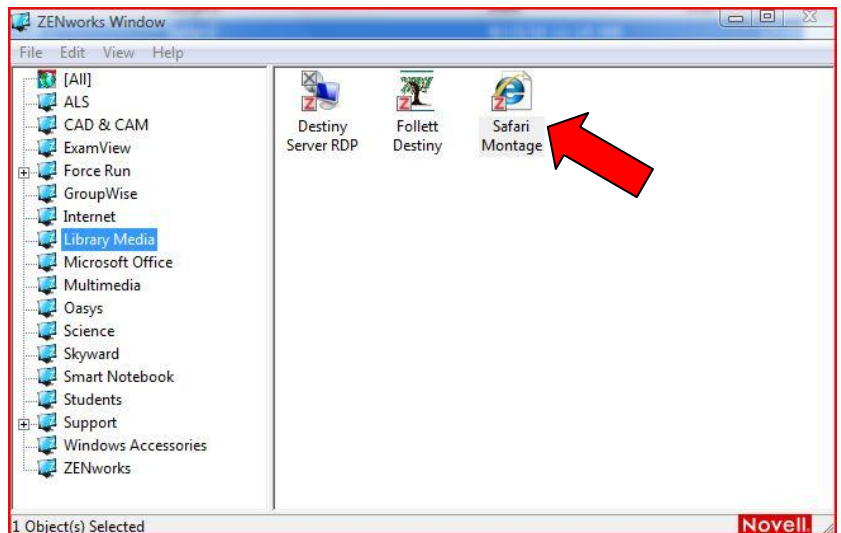
Educational Video Management

Safari's greatest strength may be its ability to allow users to create and customize their own playlists by organizing selected chapters and/or clips from videos. Unlike streaming Youtube-like videos, Safari media is locally hosted on a server within our school district. This means faster response and greater dependability for classroom use.

How do I Access Safari Montage?

Safari is a network delivered application and is hosted by our district's Library Media Department. Therefore to access Safari you will find it in your Novell menu of applications under "Library Media".



Choose your school from the drop-down menu and login using your current Novell network password.




