The Village of Germantown is comprised of over 23,000 residents and is located to the northwest of the City of Milwaukee. With its small-town rural atmosphere and easy access to Milwaukee and surrounding suburbs, Germantown is a popular choice for families.

Germantown High School

Like the Germantown School District, Germantown High School is comprised of students from several areas: Village of Germantown, Town of Germantown, and towns of Jackson, Polk, Richfield, Hubertus, Colgate and part of Cedarburg. Germantown High School is an academic community totaling 1450 students in grades 9-12.

Class Rank

Each student is ranked by cumulative GPA based on semester grades. No grades are weighted. The Class of 2011 consisted of 344 students.

Curriculum

Germantown High School offers a wide variety of courses which includes Advanced Placement courses, Youth Options program, and vocational courses with co-op, apprenticeship, and work experience. The majority of students participate in an extensive co-curricular program consisting of teams in 22 interscholastic sports as well as many active academic organizations including National Honor Society, DECA, FBLA, Bots IQ, VICA, Student Council, Key Club and Yearbook to name a few.
