Yesterday's golfers included Brad Kohn, Andrew Butler, Collin Thomey, Jack Tonnessen, and Andrew Case. Andrew Case was co-medalist shooting 77, Jack Tonnessen took 3rd and Collin Thomey 4th.
 - Our **Boys Varsity Golf Team** tied for 2nd at the Conference Final and set the school record for the lowest 18 total with a 302 (former record was 304). Leading the way was Carter Schmidt who shot a 73 and finished First Team All-Conference, Joe Mazurek with a 74 earned honorable mention, Weston Davis fired his personal best 77, Jon Dunlop with a 78, and rounding out the team was Charlie Werner with an 86.
